HIV ANTIBODY TESTING AT STUDENT HEALTH SERVICE

What is HIV Antibody testing?

HIV (Human Immunodeficiency Virus) is the virus that causes AIDS. The presence of the HIV antibody in the blood means that you have been infected with HIV. Testing the blood for the HIV antibody provides evidence of this infection. The blood test is not a test for AIDS. People with HIV antibodies may or may not have the disease AIDS.

Who can be tested at Student Health Service?

Any student eligible for care at SHS may be tested. Confidential testing includes before and after counseling with a member of the medical or health education staff. **Anonymous testing** is not offered at Student Health, but can be obtained at many of the locations listed above. **Confidential testing** is done in the Nurse's Clinic on a walk-in basis Monday through Friday 8-11:00am and 2:00-3:30pm (Weds. we open at 9:00am); the cost is \$10.00 for students without SHIP. Check in at the front desk and request "Counseling".

What is the difference between confidential and anonymous testing?

Confidential testing means your name will be printed on the test request and test results. Results are included in your confidential medical record, but separate from other medical information. Results cannot be released without your specific written authorization. *Anonymous testing* means a random identification number is used to request the test and is printed on the test result. Your name is not used in the testing process at all. Several community facilities offer HIV antibody testing and are listed on the reverse of this form.

Persons who should consider testing are:

- Persons who may have a sexually transmitted disease
- Persons sharing needles for any reason
- Persons who consider themselves at risk
- Women of childbearing age who are considering pregnancy
- Transfusion recipients before 1985
- Hemophiliacs
- Sexual partners of the above
- Persons who have intercourse (oral, vaginal, anal) without using a condom or latex protection
